

Corporate Relay

Door Policy

In order to create a safe and enjoyable event, the Corporate Relay has a door policy which will apply to all individuals at the event, including event staff. Any individuals who do not follow or breach this policy may be removed from the event at the discretion of event staff and will not be eligible for a refund.

There is a strict capacity limit for this event (4,500 attendees). Only individuals who have purchased tickets may enter the grounds. All participants will be required to wear a wristband, supplied to individuals once they have entered the event, at all times. Any individuals who are not wearing a wristband at any point during the event will be removed from the site. This rule will be applied strictly to ensure no overcrowding takes place.

Mullenbach Events reserves the right to refuse entry or to evict any individual at any point during the event.

No tickets will be available to purchase on the day.

Children

Children under 5 years old may enter the event for free. All children over 5 years of age are required to have an entry ticket. Any individual wishing to bring any children under 5 must contact race organisers prior to the event to arrange special passes. No persons of any age limit may enter the grounds without a wristband supplied by Mullenbach Events.

Seating

Chairs are allowed at the event. Each company will be allocated their own site and all individuals are required to place chairs, marketing material and other items within the boundary of their site. Participants will also be allowed to place chairs in the designated viewing areas to watch the football. Event staff may request any individuals to move their chairs if they are obstructing individuals, encroaching on another company's site or for any other reason deemed reasonable by event staff. Refusal to follow the instructions of event staff may lead to participants being evicted from site.

Personal belongings

There **will not** be a bag drop area on site and all participants will be required to look after the items they bring on site, and participants do so at their own risk. All personal items should be left at their company sites. Mullenbach Events will not take responsibility for any loss or damage of personal property at the event.

Searches

All bags will be searched when entering the event. Any attendee who refuses to have their bags searched will be refused entry. As there are multiple entrances to the estates, it may be possible for individuals to bring banned items into the venue. All attendees may be asked at any point during the event to have their bags or sites searched by security personnel. Any individuals who refuse this search may be escorted off the premises with no recourse to any refunds.

Food and beverages

No glass bottles or glass may be brought to the event.

Foods: Foods will be on sale on the day and attendees will be allowed to bring their own foods should they wish. Only plastic utensils will be permitted on site and any steel knives and forks will be confiscated.

Beverages: **Strictly NO beverages – either alcoholic or non-alcoholic - are allowed onsite whatsoever.** Water, soft drinks and alcoholic beverages will be available to purchase on the day. Any individuals who are caught bringing or have brought beverages of any kind onto the site will be evicted from the event with no recourse to a refund. This will be at the discretion of the event directors.

Frequently asked questions

Will I be searched at the door?

Yes, every person entering the event will be searched at the door and may be searched at any time during the event.

Can I buy a ticket at the door?

No, tickets will not be available at the door.

Can my children attend?

Yes, all children must have an entrance ticket to attend the event. Anyone bringing children under 5 must contact race organisers prior to the event to arrange a special pass.

What if I lose my wristband?

If you lose your wristband you must report immediately to the information tent which can be found on the hill behind the big screen TV. Any person found without a wristband will be removed from the event.

What items are not allowed?

No beverages of any kind are allowed onsite. No weapons - to include guns, knives, batons, swords, flame-throwers, throwing stars, battle axes, pepper spray, Nerf guns and baseball bats.

What should I bring with me?

You are encouraged to bring chairs and picnic blankets.

Can I bring a camera?

Yes, you may bring a camera.

Is there a bags area?

No, there will be no bag drops available. Personal belongings are to be left on your company site and attendees do as at their own risk.

Can I bring food and drink?

You may bring food to the event but no beverages will be allowed.

Which entrance should I use?

All participants and spectators must use the entrance on Toweridge Lane. There are no other access points available.

Do you have a smoking area?

Yes, there will be designated smoking areas. Smokers must use the designated smoking areas and bins provided. Smokers must not throw cigarette butts on the floor and must not put lit butts in the black bags provided. Any individual who causes a potential fire hazard may be removed off site. Any individuals who do not use the designated smoking areas may be removed off site.

Can I leave the grounds and come back?

Yes, as long as you retain your wristband.

What should I do if I have a problem on the day?

If you are having any issues on the day you should report to the information tent which can be found behind the screen.

What do I do if my personal possessions are stolen?

All individuals are responsible for their own items. If your items are stolen you should contact the police.

When is the best time to arrive?

Gates open at 8am. To avoid a buildup of traffic and queues, it is advisable to arrive as early as possible.

Will I be asked for ID?

You will not be asked for ID at the gate. You may be asked for ID at the beer tent so you are advised to bring ID with you. The right to serve alcohol is at the discretion of alcohol providers.

What do I do if someone is causing trouble?

You should call the closest security or event official to assist you.
